Dear Friends in Christ, during Lent we have been preparing by works of love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of our Lord's death and resurrection. Today we come together to begin this solemn celebration in union with the Church throughout the world. Christ enters His own city to complete His work as our Saviour, to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us go with Him in faith and love, so that united with Him in His sufferings, we may share His risen life.

The Gospel

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to St. Mark (11. 1-10)

Glory to Christ our Saviour.

When they drew near to Jerusalem, Jesus sent two of His disciples, and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a donkey tied, on which no one has ever sat; untie it and bring it." And they went away, and found a donkey tied at a door out in the open street; and they untied it. And those who stood there said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" And they brought the donkey to Jesus, and threw their garments on it; and He sat upon it. And many spread their garments on the road, and others spread palm branches which they had cut

from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out, "Hosanna! Blessed is He Who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

This is the Gospel of the Lord:
Praise to Christ our Lord.

The Blessing of the Palm Crosses

O God our Saviour, Whose Son Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem on a donkey as Messiah to suffer and die, let these palm crosses be for us signs of His victory; and grant that we who carry them in His name may ever hail Him as our King, and follow Him in the way that leads to eternal life; we ask Your blessing on these palm crosses and on our journey to the Cross, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Collect for Palm Sunday

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross: grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Philippians. (2.5-11)

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death – even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**
